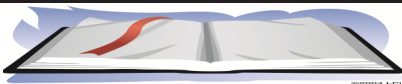

**Archdiocese of Santa Fe coronavirus (COVID-19) & Flu Precautions**  
 Please stay home if you are sick or are experiencing symptoms. If you are ill, you are not bound by the obligation to attend Mass, including on Sunday. Out of charity to others, sick individuals should not attend Mass or other liturgical events.

- During the Our Father, folded hands are the liturgical norm. Avoid bodily contact.
- During the Sign of Peace simply nod your head toward one another. Avoid bodily contact.
- Communicants MUST receive Holy Communion in the hand. Please do not ask to receive on the tongue. The Archbishop grants dispensation to those who attend the Extraordinary form to receive in the hand during these restrictions.



3RD SUNDAY OF EASTER

We often act out of ignorance. Armed with the best of intentions, we think we are seeing clearly and correctly, but we are not. We don't always understand the full meaning of things and only perceive part of the truth. Hence, our judgments and actions can be impaired by myopic, incomplete or erroneous perceptions. The meaning of life, understanding of human experience, and negotiating life's challenges can all become skewed without proper understanding and vision. The resurrection of Christ is the corrective to our incomplete and limited view of life. Looking at things with the eyes of faith brings a depth of clarity and understanding to how we see God, ourselves, others, and the world.

Even the disciples struggled with their limited understanding and ignorant perceptions. It was only when Jesus opened their minds to understand the Scriptures that their eyes were opened. It was their "aha" moment when everything clicked. We all want the substance of our lives to come together, make sense, and have meaning. This is easier to achieve when things are going positively, and life is good. It is when suffering, disappointment, death, hardship, and injustice enter the picture that things can become unsettled and disoriented. Our faith in the goodness and love of God is tested. We tend to shift our focus on these difficult and challenging moments and do not see them within the greater picture of how God intends life to unfold. We can gain, from the passion and resurrection of Christ, the clear vision we need in order to move away from ignorance to enlightenment.

We need our "aha" moment when everything comes together and clicks. It can come in a fleeting instant when we feel totally connected with God, where we find ourselves, others and all of creation. It is a moment when all is right and good, regardless of how difficult our journey. Our "aha" moment assures us that God is here, right with us, in us and around us bringing us a gift and blessing we can receive nowhere else: peace. In those brief sacramental encounters when we are lifted up out of ourselves and centered, we can hear God say, "peace be with you," and we feel secure. It's all okay. The resurrected Christ has the power to bring this gift to us. Some people, as they are facing their deaths, remark about this peace. When looking into the window of eternity, they experience a depth of joy and are amazed at God's goodness and closeness. We are called to be witnesses to this Good News.



**Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA)**

As of the end of March we have had pledges of \$11,350.00. From this amount we have had payments of \$8,25.00. We are well on our way to make our goal of \$15,000.00. We need your help. Out of 559 families only 9.66% have pledged. We have struggled to make the goal in the past two years and have had to pay from our general fund, which is the fund that we pay our bills. We struggle enough with this and cannot afford to pay ACA from our funds if we do not meet our goal. Thank you and please help us. Every little bit helps.

Many of you may already be aware that properties belonging to each parish are to be reviewed and noted as essential or non-essential. Those that are designated as non-essential are to be sold.

We also know that many of us are paying for the sins of others but through this suffering we, too, hope to bring about new resurrection.

A successful bankruptcy will provide the fairest outcome for ALL claimants, while allowing the Archdiocese to continue its mission of evangelization. The claimants committee and the Archdiocese have reached an agreement on the settlement amount, though the total is confidential by law.

Each parish has been asked to contribute towards this settlement by the sale of property deemed non-essential, donations of savings and individual donations. Some parishes are less able while others have much, and so we all have to pull together to reach the goal. The Finance Council and Father Jose are reviewing the list of properties owned by Immaculate Conception and will be responding to the Vicar General on which properties may be put up for sale. We will keep you informed of this situation as it materializes.

We need your prayers. This is a very difficult thing to do since many of our ancestors gave some of the properties and the church also worked hard to save money to purchase some of the land. For now the properties need to be appraised and valued. A broker needs to be chosen and then we go from there. We will keep you informed as we know more on which properties will be sold.

The Archdiocese of Santa Fe entered into Chapter 11 Reorganization during the first week of December 2018. The utmost concern is for the victims of abuse. Our prayers are with them. The Annual Catholic Appeal Foundation is not part of the Chapter 11 filing. ACA is separately incorporated and funding is not available for legal claims. ACA remains a significant source of funding for the ministries and services of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe throughout this process and beyond. Christ's loving work must endure through this. Thank you for continuing to support these efforts.

**ARCHDIOCESE WORKSHOP—ABUSE AWARENESS**

**IMPORTANT:** For two years we have urged all of our members who are in a ministry to take the class on "Protecting God's Children". Many have not done so. The Archdiocese of Santa Fe mandates that this class be taken. This is for your protection. Please do not let this next year go by without taking this class. If you feel that there is a reason that you are unable or care to take the class, please call the office; otherwise we expect you to comply. It takes only 45 minutes to take the class online. In order to be in a ministry or volunteer in any capacity, this is mandatory.
